This Sunday, we will worship again in the chapel at 10:30 a.m. Then, at 2 p.m., I will be leading worship at Windsorwood Place. Roger Besst has been playing piano and visiting with our elderly neighbors with me for these monthly worship services at the senior living community. Roger, organist for Trinity Episcopal Church in Coshocton, has played organ and piano for congregations for about 58 years. He joined me in the Windsorwood ministry because he feels called to use his musical gifts to lift up the folks who have endured months of quarantine and loneliness. For this ecumenical ministry and for the kindness of Roger Besst, I am truly grateful.

Roger is a peacemaker, like so many others in our community of faith. Peace is a gift Jesus offers to all his followers. The risen Christ says in John 14:27, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid." Paul, in 2 Thessalonians 3:16, says, "May the God of peace give you peace at all times and in all ways." In this week's epistle reading, James writes, "A harvest of righteousness is sown in peace for those who make peace."

On Oct. 3, we will be receiving the Peace and Global Witness Offering during worship in our main sanctuary. This PC (USA) offering is always received on Worldwide Communion Sunday. The offering "gives light to those in the shadows and guides us into the ways of peace. We come together to promote the peace of Christ by addressing systems of injustice in our own communities and around the world."

Bryce Wiebe, Director of PC(USA) Special Offerings and Appeals, says the denomination established the offering as "an expression of who we are, and one way in which we build God's house, together, with active peacemakers around the corner and around the world." Twenty-five percent of what is received stays with our congregation to support a local ministry to which God is calling us. The rest will go for regional and national peacemaking work.


Thank you for your generous gift to support peacemaking work in the name of Jesus Christ around the world.




















Who Is the Greatest?
