Letter from the Pastor

Dear friends,

Today is the great reveal of our first issue of our "new" newsletter of First Presbyterian Church of Smithtown. We are calling it "One Body, One Spirit: Connecting the Faithful." It will be more than just news from the congregation. My vision is that this will help us grow in Spirit and make a stronger connection with the Lord, as well as one another—Christ's Church.

For this "new" newsletter, I was inspired by another publication from our church called "Together in Spirit." This monthly mailing throughout the pandemic was birthed from our Dream Team. This amazing group of people, charged to do a work that had never been done in our congregation before, sought to connect and spiritually nourish members of the congregation without access to technology when our building was closed. Later, after the building reopened, the publication served people without technology who also could not attend in-person worship for reasons of health or distance.

Many thanks to those who served members who would have been marginalized by the pandemic and looked for ways of drawing together the One Body of Christ -always connected by the One Spirit, no matter what happens in this world.

We are celebrating Rally Day this Sunday, marking the beginning of our fall programs, including Sunday school and choirs. I invite all the children and youth to bring their backpacks to church; during our Time with Young Disciples, we will do a blessing of the backpacks. Also, during worship at 10, we will commission those serving in ministries of education and faith formation. Those receiving this special blessing and prayerful support from the congregation include those leading Bible studies for PW circles.

Thank you to all who serve the church, especially those who are reaching out to nurture the faith of the children and youth. Please remember to thank them for their hard work and commitment—and to pray for our teachers and the children and youth regularly. Can you think of other ways to bless them?



When you see children in church, say hello to them, introduce yourself and try to make them feel more comfortable. Please offer grace to them and their parents if the young children seem a little wiggly or chatty during some of the quiet moments of worship. This is to be expected. We are so glad they are with us and that their parents or grandparents are helping them to learn about church, the Lord, and how to sing and pray—things that are best taught by coming to church and experiencing and participating in them.

This is what it means to be a multigenerational congregation—where all people are truly welcome and made to feel as if their presence in worship matters and that their gifts and talents are valued.

In our gospel reading this week in Luke 15:1-10, Jesus tells the parable of a shepherd who seeks out one lost sheep and a woman who searches her home for a missing coin. Here are some questions for reflection to prepare your heart for Sunday's worship and the Spirit's message for the Church.

Questions for Reflection

Is there someone from whom you are estranged, a friend or family member, or a person from your church you haven't seen in a while? Pray about the situation, and, if appropriate, find a way to contact that person and let them know you have missed them.

Morning Prayer

O Lord, have mercy on us this day according to your steadfast love. Create clean hearts and new spirits within us and open our lips to declare your praise. Direct our paths so that we are always in your will; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.

Evening Prayer

We give you thanks and praise, O God, for seeking us when we were lost, for sweeping us up from the darkness, for gathering us into your fold, and for holding us in the palm of your hand. Bring all your wandering children home, so that there may be rejoicing in your church and joy in the presence of your angels; through Jesus Christ our Savior. Amen.



EXECUTIVE COORDINATOR'S REPORT:

- We were open 13 Days (Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays, 10am 12 noon)
 We were open 5 Wednesday Evenings, 5pm 7 pm (had 11 clients)
- 125 Guests came to the Pantry:
 - Total Persons Served = 494
 - o 345 Adults
 - o 108 children 5-18
 - o 41 infant 4 years
 - 90 Families from Smithtown Township 35 Families from outside township
 - 14 new clients (8 from Smithtown Township 6 from outside township)
 - 9 clients came to the pantry more than once during the month of August



- We continue to provide for Blessing Box, Blydenburgh Park
- Milk & Eggs were delivered to the Pantry each week
- Most weeks we are able to purchase chop meat from Fresh Market and chicken parts from Shop Rite & Stop & Shop
- We continue to do A LOT of shopping Thank You to various volunteers who shop for us at local stores, (Aldi, Costco, Dollar Tree)
- Thank you to volunteers who pick up bread and bakery items every Monday and Tuesday morning from King Kullen in St. James and Fresh Market in Smithtown
- Monetary donations for August \$5,255.13 (including \$1,100 from Sunrise Rotary)
- We have estimates for driveway repaying and are reviewing
- We are exploring new ideas for garage renovations as original ideas are proving to be more expensive than anticipated
- A new Finance and Audit committee has been formed (Pat Westlake, Jeff Smith, Marge Modelewski and Marci Deakins) and will hold their first meeting on September 12

We had another great month of Church Volunteers returning!!! St. Thomas of Canterbury came out in force!! And our "REGULARS" showed them the ropes!!
