Letter from the Pastor

Dear friends!

What a joy to proclaim with my church family, "Christ the Savior is born!" I look forward to seeing everyone at our two Christmas Eve services—at 5 and 9 p.m.—and/or on Christmas Day at 10 a.m. Our 5 p.m. worship this Saturday will be a multigenerational service and include both our Time with Young Disciples and an adult message, as well as familiar Christmas songs. At the 9 p.m. service, I will share an adult message, handbells will ring, our Sanctuary Choir will sing, and we will celebrate Communion.

This is our last *One Body, One Spirit* of 2022. **Our next OBOS** will be published Jan. 20, 2023.

I will be on Continuing Education leave on Jan. 8 and 15, traveling to Austin Presbyterian Seminary. Dulcie McLeod will share a message on Jan. 8 and the Rev. Emmie Arnold will lead worship and preach on Jan. 15. I will be back leading worship on Jan. 22, when we will welcome and install new elders and deacons, chosen by our congregation on Dec. 18. Thank you to all who serve in leadership roles in our congregation!



On Sunday, Jan. 1, we will celebrate the First Sunday of Christmas with a Lessons and Carols service, with Communion. Although the tradition of Nine Lessons and Carols is usually for Christmas Eve and is popularly associated with King's College, Cambridge, its origins are traced to Truro Cathedral in Cornwall. Before the 19th century, the singing of Christmas carols was done by singers visiting people's houses; hymns were not sung in worship because they were considered too secular. This changed in the Victorian era, when the rising popularity of hymnody encouraged church musicians to introduce carols into worship. The nine lessons and carols tell the story of Christ the Savior, beginning with the OT prophecies and ending with a beautiful, poetic passage from the gospel of John. I find the last 4 verses of this passage to be the most moving:

¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through him, yet the world did not know him. ¹¹ He came to what was his own, and his own people did not accept him. ¹² But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

I pray that we will come to know the Lord, more and more, in 2023, and all God's grace and truth. For the Lord wants to be known, loved, and worshiped. You are the children of God, with the power of the Holy Spirit living inside you and dwelling in our midst, whenever we gather in Christ's name. You are never alone!

Happy Christmas to all—to you and your families. May you shine with the Light of Christ!


Workers earn scrip, not money, and the scrip is usually not enough to cover bare necessities from the company store.




